Pete Good was born in St. Louis, MO, the oldest of seven children. He went to parochial grade schools in St. Louis and graduated from Saint Louis University High School. He attended Saint Louis University but transferred and graduated from Washington University in Saint Louis with a BS degree in accounting.

He started working for McDonnell Douglas Aircraft, which is now part of Boeing. At that time, he also joined the Army Reserve and stayed for six years. After two years with McDonnell Douglas, he joined General Motors in finance and accounting and stayed in Saint Louis with the Chevrolet division for six years. He was then transferred to Detroit. He stayed with General Motors for 36 years working all over the Detroit area. For a period of seven years he had a new job every 18 months, always in finance and accounting.

When he was first transferred to the Detroit area, he found a house on Chesterfield in Birmingham in two days, and he is still there after 55 years.

He met his high school sweetheart, Margaret Medler, at a bus stop when she was 14 years old and he was 16. She passed away five years ago after 57 years of marriage. He still misses her every day. He has one daughter and four grandchildren. But unfortunately, all four of the grandchildren live out of town, so he doesn’t see them as much as he would like.

Willy was proud of his membership in the American Legion which adopted the poppy as its official symbol of remembrance in 1920.

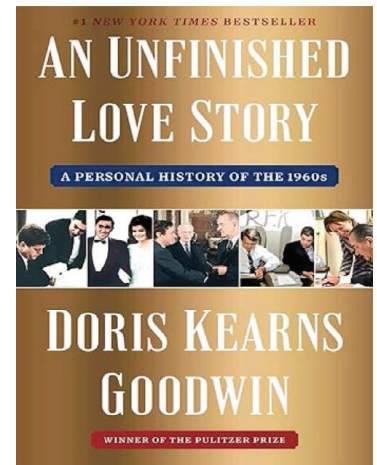
Note. It's time to start thinking about books to nominate for the next round of third Monday discussions. The current calendar goes through September. Nominations will be due on July 25.

Wednesday, July 2, at 10:30 AM: An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960's by Doris Kearns Goodwin (New York: Simon and Schuster, 2024). The discussion will be led by Bob Maxfield.

This wonderful book artfully weaves together biography, memoir, and history. Goodwin takes you along on the emotional journey she and her husband, Richard (Dick) Goodwin embarked upon in the last years of his life.

From the Washington Post's review:

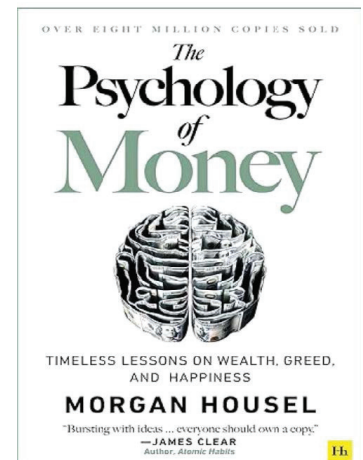
"Despite so many predecessors, Goodwin's new book, *An Unfinished Love Story*, manages to be different than anything that has come before. Goodwin and her husband, Richard, were both extremely close to the Kennedys and Johnson, and each of them held on to their fierce and competing loyalties to the presidents through four decades of marriage. Kearns gives us hundreds of interesting vignettes about the time she and her husband spent with these historic characters.



Monday, July 21, at 3 PM: *The Psychology of Money: Timeless Lessons of Wealth, Greed and Happiness* by Morgan Housel (New York: Harriman House, 2020). Bob Stevenson will lead this discussion.

Morgan Housel is an award-winning author and former columnist for the WSJ. *The Psychology of Money* is premised on doing well with money has little to do with how smart you are and a lot to do with how you behave. This may be at odds with our investment group's opinions as active investors but provides some great discussion points. Housel gives us about twenty things to think about when investing. He does this by sharing 19 short stories exploring the different ways people think about money and teaches you how to make better sense of one of life's most important topics.

Popular author Daniel Pink wrote, "Few people write about finance with the graceful clarity of Morgan Housel. *The Psychology of Money* is an essential read for anyone who wants to make wiser decisions or live a richer life."

CLASSIC MOVIE GROUP

On Monday, July 14th at 1:00 PM, The Classic Movie Group will present, via Zoom, the outstanding courtroom drama “A Few Good Men” (1992) (2 hours / 18 minutes). Adapted from Arron Sorkin’s Broadway Play and directed by Rob Reiner, the story takes place in the Washington, DC area, where a military lawyer, Lt. Daniel Kaffee, (Tom Cruise) is defending two US Marines charged with killing a fellow Marine at the Guantanamo Naval Base. Although Kaffee is known for seeking plea bargains, a fellow lawyer, Lt. Cdr. JoAnne Galloway, (Demi Moore) convinces him that the accused Marines were probably carrying out an order to kill from a commanding officer. In an effort to uncover the conspiracy, Lt. Kaffee takes a grave risk by calling Col. Nathan R Jessup (Jack Nicholson) to the stand. It results in one of the most recognized lines in movie history.

A “Few Good Men” was both a commercial and critical success and remains very popular to this day with a Rotten Tomatoes score of 84% and an IMDb score of 7.7/10. The film is regarded as one of the best military trial films by many military and commercial reviewers and critics.

SCORE UPDATE

Since 1964, SCORE has supported nearly 20 million business owners through free mentoring and affordable education. These services have been made possible thanks to the dedication of over 10,000 volunteers and a federal grant administered by the Small Business Administration (SBA).

However, the proposed federal budget for fiscal year 2026 includes the elimination of funding for 15 SBA programs—SCORE among them.

Currently, SCORE's national office receives \$17 million in federal funding, while our Southeast Michigan chapter receives just \$4 thousand. Still, we depend heavily on administrative support from the national office.



Our SE Michigan chapter operates on an annual budget of approximately \$100 thousand funded primarily by local SE Michigan foundations. Most of it goes for salaries for two administrative assistants and our Ferndale office. While we anticipate that SCORE will continue through private grants and possibly partial federal support, the future structure may change. For now, it's business as usual.

We remain busy mentoring a wide range of small business owners—and we have more requests for help than we have mentors. Our SMCB SCORE group includes: LaCount, Powe, Rajpal, Vorce, Kafarski, Stevens, Garner, Culp, Reynolds, Burke, Stone, Rappleye, Jacobs, Zeid, McGee, and Jitesh Desai.

RAFIQUE TAI CHAIRS THE VISITATION AND HEALTH COMMITTEE

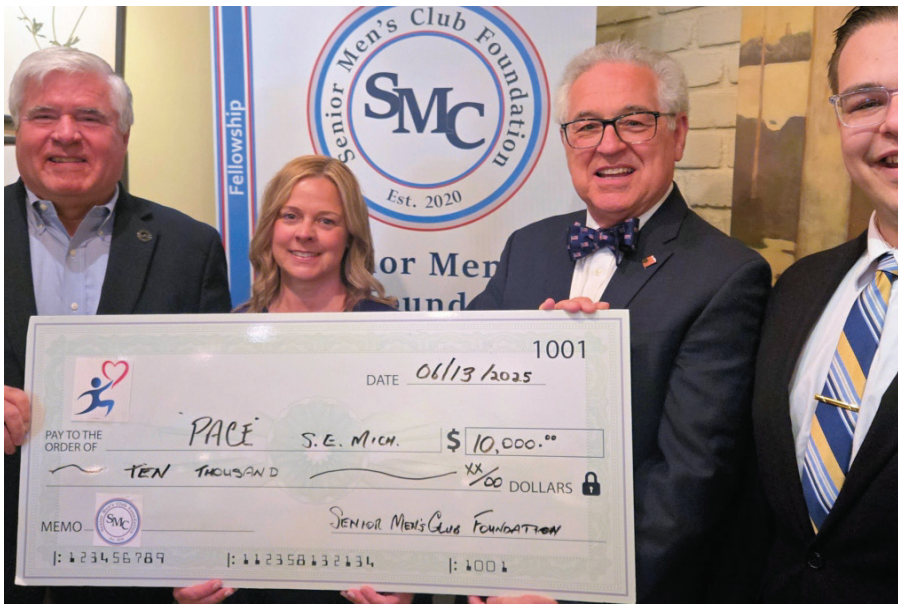
